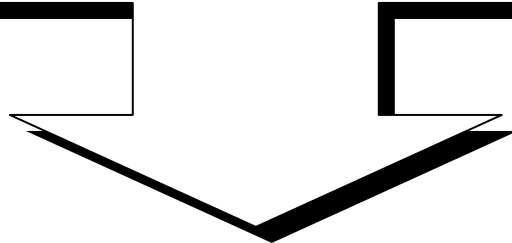

# Wise Reasons to Choose a Career

# Hear & Follow God's Calling

Calling is the truth that God calls us to Himself so decisively that everything we are, everything we do, and everything we have is invested with a special devotion, dynamism and direction lived out as a response to His summons and service." The following 11 actions have helped people hear and follow God and His calling.

## 1. **Worship God**

There is no calling without a Caller. Take dedicated time to worship, glorify, praise and thank Him. Then as you live and work every day from waking until sleeping, do everything to honor Him.

*Ascribe to the LORD the glory due His name; worship...in the splendor of His holiness. Psalm 29:2*

## 2. **Read and Study the Bible**

The Bible is God's authority and our manual for living. Consider it as bread, and feed from it every day. If you have never read the Bible, consider starting with the book of John, Ephesians or Psalms.

*Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path. Psalm 119:105*

## 3. **Pray**

Be in conversation with God every day, perhaps multiple times during every day. He is always available. Pray for guidance. Read a Psalm as your own personal prayer.

*Show me the way I should go, for to You I lift up my soul. Psalm 143:8*

## 4. **Listen to God**

Prayer is two-way communication. In a journal, notebook or this Workbook, write thoughts that come to your mind for later reflection and Bible study.

*Be still, and know that I am God. Psalm 46:10*

## 5. **Be with Christians**

Spend time with Christians who you like and who like you. Study the Bible together. Pray together. Encourage one another. Follow the ABCs of Accountability, Belonging and Care.

*... consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Hebrews 10:24*

## 6. **Seek Wise Counsel**

Seek wisdom first from above (James 3:17) and then from other people. Some may be friends. Some may be strangers with whom you talk to only once.

*Let the wise listen and add to their learning,  
and let the discerning get guidance. Proverbs 1:5*

7. **Consider Unfolding Circumstances**

Be a good steward of the opportunities God gives you. Consider each situation with God in prayer. Always measure your prayer, counsel and unfolding circumstances in light of the truth of the Bible.

*Be very careful, then, how you live...  
making the most of every opportunity... Ephesians 5:15-16*

8. **Confess and Clear Your Head**

A clear head is critical in thinking through options and seeking God's leading. It is easy to become confused, especially if sin is getting in the way. Confess it, and clear it out every day.

*If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous  
to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us... 1 John 1:9*

9. **Be Alert for God's Peace**

As you consider various options and paths, be alert for the peace that transcends all understanding, even in the midst of the most chaotic of times.

*And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding,  
will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:7*

10. **Keep a Journal**

Keep track of what you learn from your Bible reading, thoughts you have during prayer, advice you receive from your friends, unfolding circumstances and things that bring you God's peace.

*Thus says the LORD... "Write all the words which I have spoken to you in a book." Jeremiah 30:2*

11. **Trust and Obey**

There is no other way! If you think the Lord wants you to do something, and it seems to be in alignment with everything we have been talking about, then do it! If you hear Him, follow Him.

*Whoever has My commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves Me. He who loves Me  
will be loved by My Father, and I too will love him and show Myself to him. John 14:21*

### God is Calling You

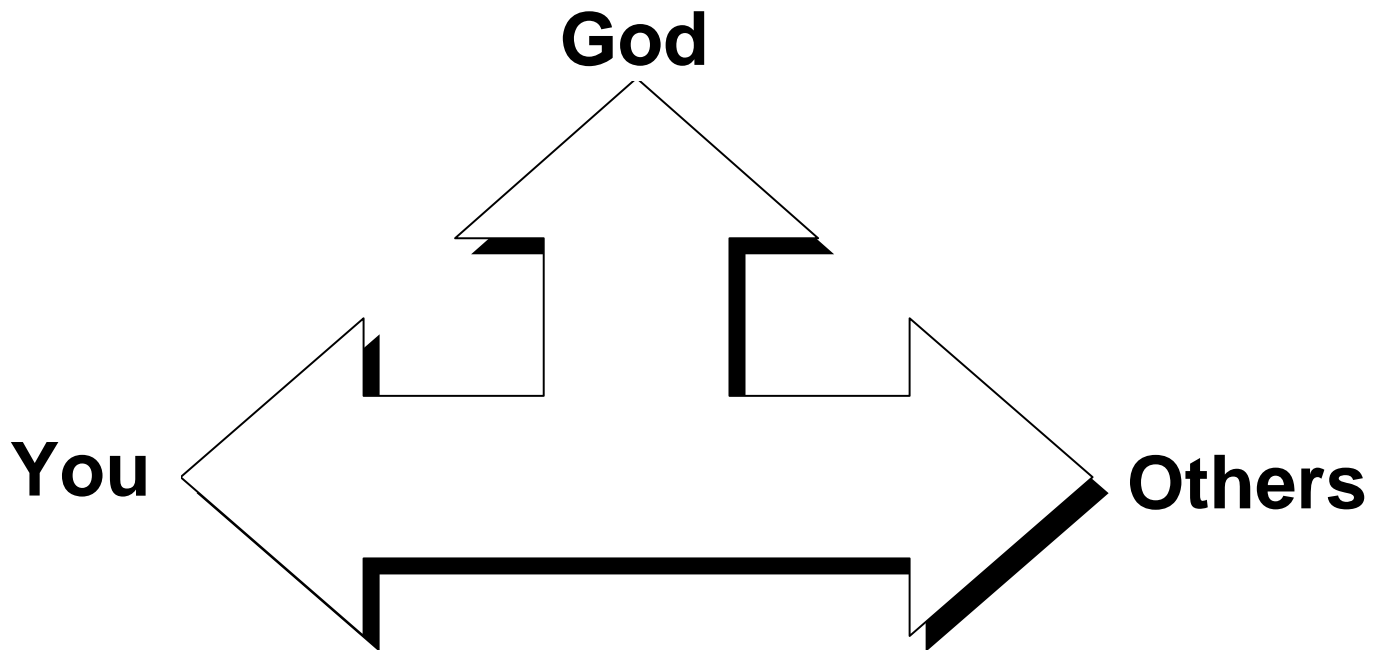

### Joseph

Even though he was thrown in a pit by his brothers, put in jail in Egypt and betrayed by those around him, Joseph's faith remained strong, trusting that God would use his circumstances for his good.

**Result of his positive attitude:** God made Joseph 2<sup>nd</sup> in command of all of Egypt and saved the land from famine.  
**Genesis 37-50**

### Paul

While Paul suffered beatings, time in prison, rejection, humiliation and shipwrecks, he remained focused on the calling that God had placed on his life.

**Result of his positive attitude:** God used Paul to spread the gospel throughout the Roman world and to write several books of the Bible.  
**Acts-Philemon**

### Esther

Even though Esther was an orphaned Jewish girl, God called her to go to the kingdom of Susa to be presented before the king as a choice for his next queen.

**Result of her positive attitude:** Esther was chosen queen by King Xerxes; and she eventually saved the Jews from destruction because of her faith in God to protect her and the Jewish people.  
**Esther 1-10**

### David

While David was only a shepherd boy, God called him to face Goliath. He provided him with the courage and strength to stand up against the Philistine warrior – and WIN!

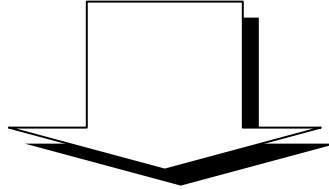
**Result of his positive attitude:** After the death of Saul, God appointed David as the next king of Israel. He also wrote several books of the Bible.

This is the first day of the rest of your life. You can make decisions now for the better that will last forever. Ask yourself:

**“How would I like to see my future?”**

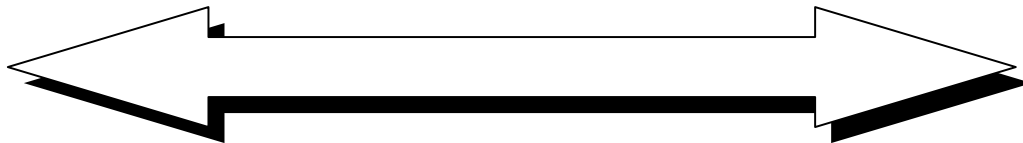
**“Did God put me here for some reason? What is the purpose of my life?”**

**“When I am 84 years old and looking back on my life, what would I like to see?”**

**“How will God view my life?”**

Begin to picture your life after high school and your life’s calling in ways in which you are content, fulfilled and in alignment with God’s will. Make plans and think about what it will take to accomplish this.

## In Breadth



By now you may feel anxious, maybe even terrified. Getting ready for life after high school can be fearful, and it requires acts of faith, such as love, power, discipline, prayer and even thanksgiving. As you start each day, consider these truths from the Bible:

*There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear. 1 John 4:18*

*Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension shall guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7*

# Aptitude

Discover & Develop Your Strengths

---

**You are uniquely designed by God. No other person has your DNA and personal history.** Discover your incredible gifts and deep passions. Be prepared to add, subtract and modify what you know about you.

in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully  
and wonderfully made...*

*Psalm 139:13-14*

## **5 Factors in Your Unique Design:**

The better you understand you, the better you can see how to prepare yourself for life after high school. Consider these 5 factors:

1. **Experiences:** Your background – Personal, educational, vocational
2. **Abilities:** What you do best – Talents, knowledge, skills
3. **Personality:** How you do what you do best – Natural behavior traits
4. **Interests:** What you like best – People, places, things and activities you enjoy
5. **Values:** What is important to you – Work and life purpose, principles or points of pain

Experiences + Abilities + Personality = Gifts: Your gifts are the combination of your experiences (personal, educational, vocational), abilities (talents, knowledge, skills), and your personality (natural behavioral traits).

Interests + Values = Passions: Your passions include your interests (what you like best) and your values (what is important to you). Passions motivate you to use your gifts in particular ways and places.

# Employ Your Passions as Well as Gifts

A team of researchers followed a group of 1,500 people over a period of 20 years. At the outset of the study, the participants were divided into 2 groups:

- Group A, 83% of the sample, was composed of people embarking on a career path they had chosen solely for the prospect of making money now in order to do what they wanted later in life.
- Group B, the other 17% of the sample, consisted of people who had chosen their career paths so that they could do what they wanted now and worry about the money later.

The data showed some startling revelations:

- At the end of the 20-year period, 101 of the 1,500 had become millionaires.
- Of the millionaires, all but one - 100 out of 101 - were from Group B, the group that had chosen to pursue what they loved.

The key ingredient in most successful projects is **loving what you do**. Having a goal or a plan is not enough. Academic preparation is not enough. Prior experience is not enough. Enjoyment of your life's work is the key.

## Introducing the X Factor

The “X” Factor is the active presence of Jesus Christ in your life. It begins the millisecond you are created anew in Christ Jesus by accepting Him as your Lord and Savior...

*“Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature;  
the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.”*

2 Corinthians 5:17

Your gifts and passions, ignited by the Holy Spirit, are manifested as spiritual gifts and God's calling for you to minister for the good of others, not only in church, but also in your home, school and future work life.

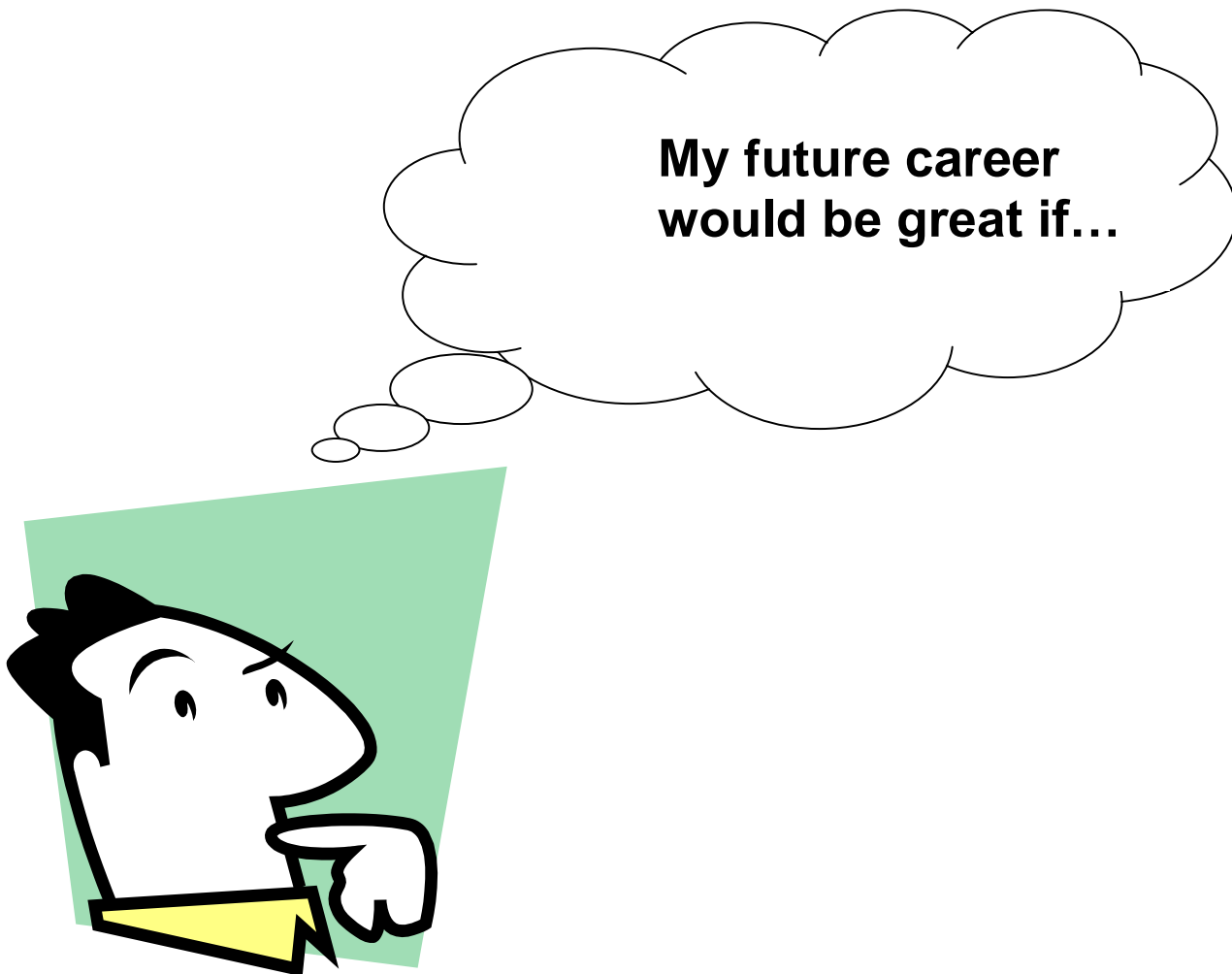

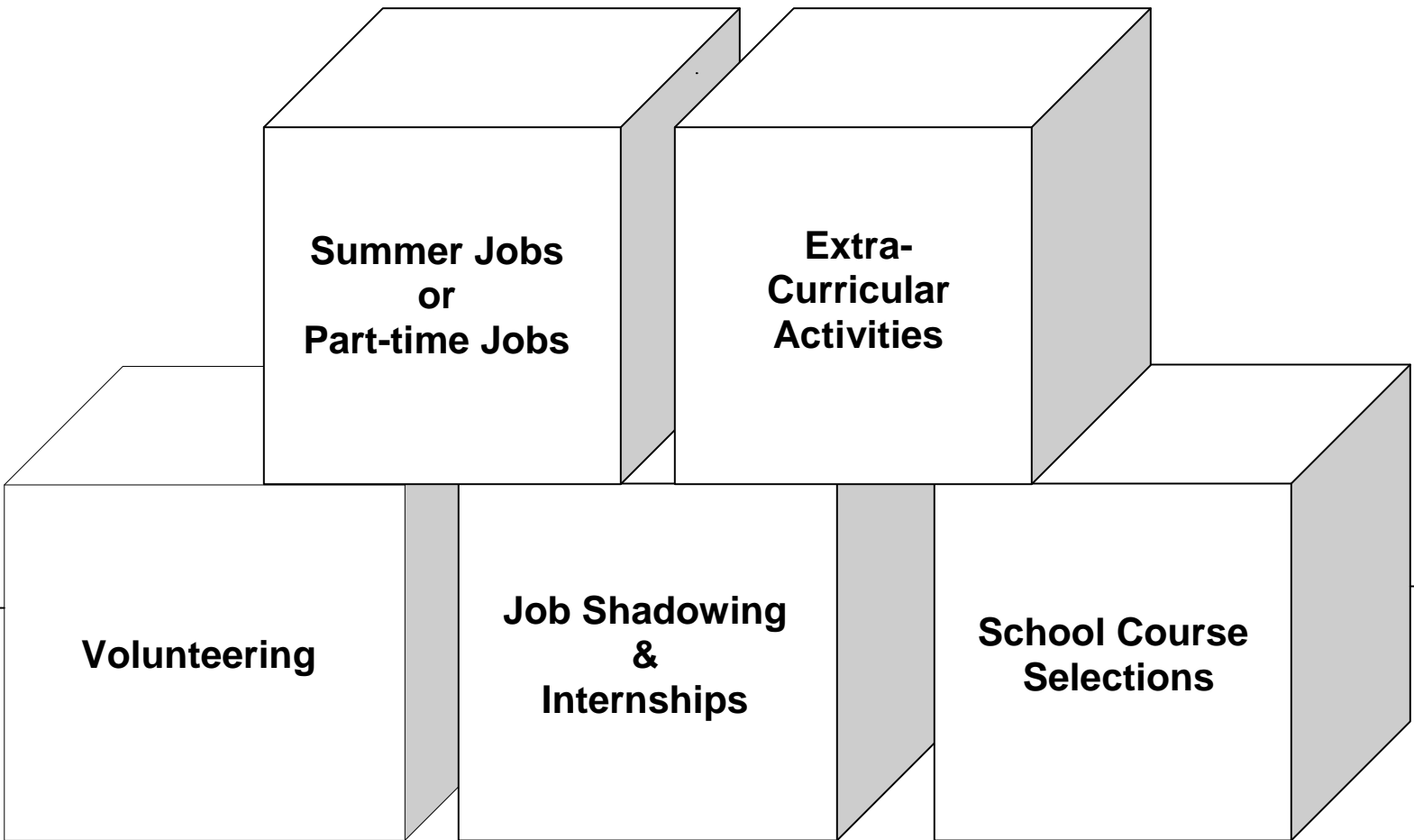

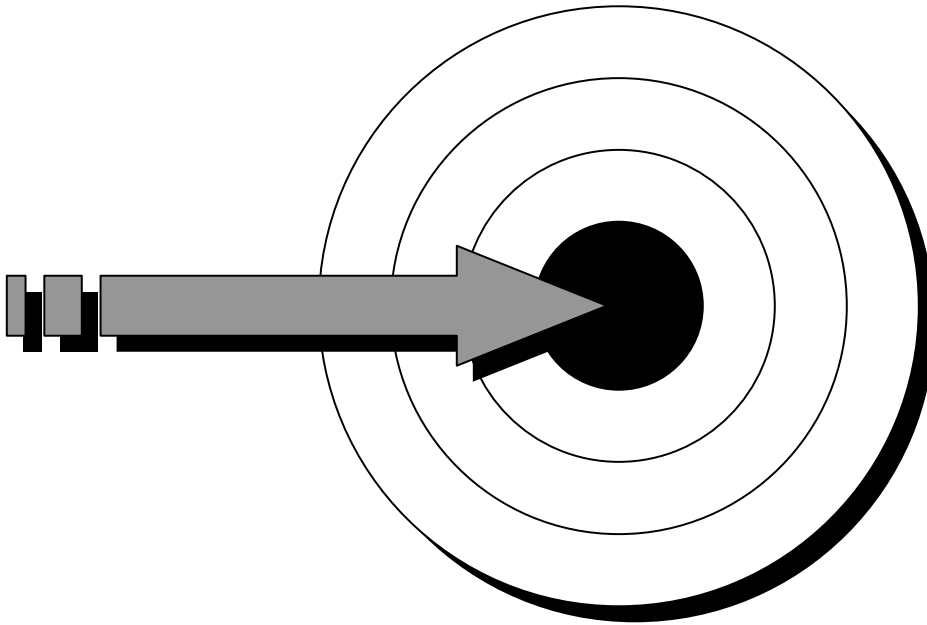

# The Interview – Telling Your Story

Think of an interview like a first date. In a short amount of time, you meet someone new; and in the first few minutes, you will know whether it is a good fit for you or not.

Here are some general interview questions that an interviewer might ask you. Read them and think about your answers before you work with your partner. Then, with a partner, interview each other using these questions as a template.

**1. Tell me about yourself?**

(Elevator Speech)

**2. What do you know about our company?**

(Student Employer will make up a fake company)

**3. Why do you want to work for us?**

**4. What makes you more capable than someone else to fill this position?**

(Interviewee goes briefly over accomplishments and experiences)

**5. In what areas would you like to improve?**

(Interviewee explains how they would like to improve in areas that would complement this position)

**6. What are your strengths that would complement this position?**

**7. How do you think you can fit this job into your schedule? Do you have any restrictions when you can't work?**

(Interviewee goes over how they can do this job and school at the same time)

**8. If I spoke to one of your coaches, counselors, or teachers, what would he or she say are your greatest strengths?**

**9. What are some of your favorite activities, sports, hobbies?**

**10. What are your future goals after high school?**



# The Interview – Discovering Their Story

While telling your story is very important, part of the interview should be you asking the interviewer about the company and the job itself.

After going through the last 5 steps, it is important to take action and step forward into the next opportunity that God wants you to experience in your journey. Part of moving forward includes the following statements:

- What is my attitude as I move forward into the next opportunity?
- What are my strengths that I can use to both glorify God and serve others?
- What do I dream about on a daily basis that could become reality?
- What opportunities could I pursue in order to further develop my strengths?
- Which experiences could provide me with a better understanding of particular careers and if they could be a good fit for me after college?

Discovering your unique career paths can be very challenging if you do not take time to learn more about yourself, to gain various experiences, and, most importantly, to focus your attention on God and where He is leading you.
